<sup>5</sup>Students should take their required Theory course prior to the required Research Methods course (if possible; exceptions granted for students whose off-campus study semesters prevent this sequence). Theory courses are as follows:

COMM 301, Communication Theory, is required for Interpersonal Concentration and Media Concentrations

COMM 302, Rhetorical Theory (taught only in fall semester), is required for Rhetoric and Theater Concentrations, and may be substituted with 301 for Media Concentration.

<sup>6</sup>Students should take their required Theory course prior to the required Research Methods course (if at all possible; exceptions granted for students whose off-campus study semesters prevent this sequence). Research Methods courses are as follows:

COMM 311, Communication Research (taught only in spring semester) is required for Interpersonal Concentration and may be substituted with 312 for Media Concentration;

COMM 312, Communication Criticism (taught both semesters) is required for Rhetoric, Theater, and Media Concentrations.

<sup>7</sup>All Communication majors are required to take 2 hours of Communication electives. In some situations, additional electives may be required to meet the 32 hour minimum for the major.

-There are many paths for Communication majors. Starting the major after freshman year is generally not a problem.
