- -Music majors will enroll in Recital-Concert attendance (MUEP 219) each semester, which will give them opportunities to hear guest performers and speakers, as well as perform for their peers.
- -Music History core classes (MUCS 262, 263, 361) should be taken in order, if possible
- -Prospective and current Conservatory of Music students are encouraged to read the <u>Wheaton</u> College Conservatory Handbook.
