



Guidelines for Transferring Courses to Meet Christ at the Core™ Requirements

Students who enroll in dual enrollment courses or who plan to complete courses outside of Wheaton can use this guide to help determine how courses might transfer as part of Wheaton's Christ at the Core (CATC) general education requirement. Current Wheaton students require pre-approval for any course they plan to transfer back to Wheaton College. Current students should use the Transfer Course Approval form located on the forms page of the Registrar's website.

Requirement	Courses that can be transferred for this requirement
Core Competencies	
First-Year Writing	At most community colleges, students will need to complete Composition 1 AND 2 to meet the first-year writing requirement. From a four-year college, if both courses are offered, both courses are required. The course(s) must require that has a significant research project and covers library research skills.
Oral Communication	A public speaking course usually meets this requirement. Students should prepare and deliver different types of speeches as a class requirement. This course must be taken in person. Online courses are not accepted for transfer credit.
Modern and Classical Language	Please see the Modern and Classical Languages website for detailed information on meeting the language requirement. Language courses must be taken in person. Online courses are not accepted for transfer credit.

SHARED CORE	<i>Shared Core courses may not be transferred, except by transfer students who were matriculated students who lived in residence at a CCCU School. Courses taken for dual enrollment credit will not be considered for Shared Core credit.</i>
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THEMATIC CORE	<i>A maximum of four themes may be met with transfer credit for BA or BS students. Current students will not be given approval for transferring in more than four themes after matriculation. Each transfer course may receive only one theme. BM and BME seeking students are limited to one theme that may be met with transfer credit. Junior transfer students (60 hours or more of eligible transfer credit) who are seeking a BA or BS may earn up to six themes prior to starting classes at Wheaton College. Once transfers begin courses at Wheaton, transfer themes are locked. Current students should check Degree Works before submission of Transfer Credit Approval Form for themes already met with transfer credit.</i>
Applied Abstract & Quantitative Reasonings (AAQR)	Finite Math, Pre-Calculus, Elementary/Introduction to Statistics, Applied Calculus, Calculus for Business and Social Science*, and Calculus I*
Diversity in the US (DUS)	Race and Social Justice in United States, Cultural Diversity in the United States
Global Perspectives (GP)	Courses covering Non-U.S. & European identities and relationships in a global context
Historical Perspectives (HP)	World History Ancient to Modern, World History 1600-present
Literary Explorations (LE)	Introduction to Literature, World/Global Literature, Classical/Early British Lit
Philosophical Investigations (PI)	Introduction to Philosophy, World Religions courses focused on beliefs and traditions
Scientific Issues & Perspectives (SIP)	Introduction to Astronomy, Environmental Issues
Scientific Practice (SP)	Principles of Biology, Introductory or General Physics, Introduction to Geology/Earth Science. All courses must have a weekly in-person lab component. <i>Anatomy and Physiology, as well as Chemistry, are not considered SP courses. If students intend to be a science major, they must take physics with calculus.</i>

Social Inquiry (SI)	Introduction to Anthropology, Principles of Microeconomics, American Politics & Government, Introduction to Political Philosophy, Comparative Politics, International Relations, Introduction to Sociology, Introduction to Psychology
Visual & Performing Arts (VPA)	Art Appreciation, Music Appreciation, or Global Music Survey. Studio art courses cannot be taken at other institutions to meet this theme.

CURRENT STUDENTS: A Transfer Credit Approval (TCA) Form must be submitted to the Academic Advising Office for pre-approval for any course to be taken at another school. Courses for a major, minor, or certificate must have department approval.

**Some majors require Calculus I for the major or as a pre-requisite for the major. We do not recommend Calculus for Business if students intend to pursue those majors. Please consult the Wheaton College Catalog at www.wheaton.edu/catalog regarding current requirements and policies.*
