BILINGUAL ENDORSEMENT for ELEMENTARY, MIDDLE, OR SECONDARY CERTIFICATION

To earn a Bilingual endorsement from the Illinois State Board of Education, a teacher must:

- (1) hold (or be earning) a valid Illinois teaching license,
- (2) have bilingual clinical experience totaling 100 clock hours,
- (3) have earned credits totaling 18 semester hours in four course areas: Theoretical Foundations of Teaching ESL, Assessment of the Bilingual Student, Methods and Materials for Teaching ESL, Methods and Materials for Bilingual Education, Cross-Cultural Studies for Teaching LEP Students.
- (4) Successful completion of the Target Language Proficiency Test for the non-English language (available in 26 different languages). *See info below*.
