# English as a Second Language ENDORSEMENT for ELEMENTARY, MIDDLE, OR SECONDARY CERTIFICATION

#### **Definition of Endorsement:**

To earn an ESL endorsement from the Illinois State Board of Education, a teacher must:

- (1) hold (or be earning) a valid Illinois teaching license,
- (2) have ESL clinical experience totaling 100 clock hours
- (3) have earned credits totaling 18 semester hours in five course areas: Linguistics, Theoretical Foundations of Teaching ESL, Assessment of the Bilingual Student, Methods and Materials for Teaching ESL, Cross-Cultural Studies for Teaching EL Students.

The ESL endorsement is valid for K-12 grade range, regardless of initial licensure grade range.

These can include EDUC 136L, EDUC 225L, and select hours from methods and student teaching. You must submit records of the hours that were specifically with ELs.
