Mock Interview Guidelines

Mock Interviews give applicants to a health professions school the opportunity to practice interviewing in a less threatening environment.

Value of doing the mock interview:

- You can process what you learned about yourself to improve for actual interviews.
- Feedback received will facilitate improvement of your interviewing skills and self-presentation.

Mock Interview Format

- Interviewers: Faculty members of the Health Professions Committee or alumni community members in the health professions
- Simulation: Faculty will provide the interview setting of the school the student will interview
- Mock Interview length: varies, normally an hour total
- Feedback will be provided immediately on your interviewing skills and self-presentation.

Examples of Questions

- Why are you convinced this is the best health profession for you?
- What interests you about the program to which you are currently applying?
- What has been your most difficult obstacle to overcome in preparing for the health professions?
- What experiences have confirmed your choice of profession?
- What experience have you had with individuals who are underserved in healthcare?

Scheduling

You are welcome to contact the Health Professions office when you have been invited to interview with a professional school.

The Health Professions office requests at least one week's notice to schedule a mock interview.
